Title

South Oxfordshire Core Strategy 2027 Development Plan Document

Subject matter

South Oxfordshire District Council formally adopted the South Oxfordshire Core Strategy 2027 Development Plan Document on Thursday 13 December 2012. An independent Inspector appointed by the Government examined the soundness of the Core Strategy following its submission to the Secretary of State in March 2011. The Inspector's Report was issued on 23 October 2012. He found the Core Strategy sound and capable of adoption subject to a number of main modifications

The core strategy sets out our vision for South Oxfordshire to 2027. It shows how we have developed a strategy that responds to our vision and how we will deliver it by working in partnership with everyone with a stake in the future of the district. It covers the entire district of South Oxfordshire.

Inspection

Challenge

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the South Oxfordshire Core Strategy 2027 Development Plan Document may make application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Act. Any challenge must fall under one or more of two categories. 1) That the document is not within the appropriate powers 2) And/or that a procedural requirement has not been with complied with. Any such application must be made not later than six weeks after the adoption date (13 December 2012).
