Ensure effective planning policies



South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse district councils are working together on a Joint Local Plan which will guide the kinds of new housing and jobs needed and where they should go, informing planning application decisions for the districts. In the Joint Local Plan we are developing planning policies that help address the climate emergency, restore nature, and meet the needs of our residents, such as delivering genuinely affordable low-carbon homes with the right infrastructure to go with it. After three years of preparation, in December 2024 the councils reached the milestone of submitting the Joint Local Plan to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government. The examination by independent Planning Inspectors is underway, with the first stage of public stages held over three days in June 2025, and the second stage planned for later in 2025, subject to outcomes of stage one.



Deliver change projects to drive transformation



In December 2024 the Government announced a restructure of local government which will see two-tier authorities, as we have in Oxfordshire, end and new unitary councils created. In February 2025, South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse district councils partnered with West Berkshire unitary authority to submit an interim proposal for a new unitary authority called 'Ridgeway Council'. The Ridgeway proposal sits alongside a proposed Oxford and Shires unitary authority which would comprise the existing district areas of Cherwell, Oxford City and West Oxfordshire. Two other proposals were submitted with alternative models for the unitarisation of the Oxfordshire area; Oxfordshire County Council proposed a single unitary authority on the current county boundaries, while Oxford City proposed a three unitary authority model that would extend the boundaries of the city to create a 'Greater Oxford' unitary authority alongside remodelled Ridgeway and Oxford and Shires authorities.

In June 2025 the Government provided its initial feedback on the models proposed for local Government in Oxfordshire and invited final proposals to be submitted by November 28 2025. Officials have been working collaboratively with colleagues from all Oxfordshire authorities and West Berkshire to develop and finalise the Ridgeway/Oxford and Shires proposal. This has included extensive public and stakeholder engagement, data sharing, research and analysis. The draft proposal will proceed through a democratic review process in October and November 2025 before being submitted to Government on November 28.
